





- Period Camping separate modern camping/no hookups. Bring water.
- Prospective and beginning buckskinners are welcome. Don't be bashful if your gear isn't perfect yet. We can help you.
- All shooting will be out of the pouch, using traditional weapons with open open metal sights and patched round balls.
