October 1st club shoot winners. Eleven shooters. A 20-shot silhouette shoot with cross sticks.



These individuals continually are able to compete successfully at all levels within the muzzle loading shooting sports. By now hopefully all of you have gotten the news of the 25 yard berm improvements that are underway as I write this. We have made significant advances in improving our range over the course of this year. From raising the 100, 50 and now 25 yard line berms; replacing metal target stands with wooden railroad ties to reduce riccochet risks and shortening the target frames to lower the point of aim on the berm. All these efforts will go a long way to ensuring the viability of our club well into the future by increasing the safety of our facilities. These efforts have at time come at mild inconvience to the membership in the short term while the ranges must be closed for the safety of heavy equipment operators. I make absolutely no apoligies for these temporary inconviences as my position requires me to look to and guard the future of our club. One should plant trees even if they'll never be able to sit in its shade. Others will.

This November 5th is the Turkey Shoot First Sunday Match Cross-sticks buffalo targets (50 & 100 yds.), 25 yd pistol shoot. Come out for a chance to win HEB gift cards to redeem for a Thanksgiving turkey.

The Texas Skirmish Association will host a Veteran's Day Skirmish on November 11th. Uniforms are encouraged. Registration begins at 0800; range setup at 0830 and match begins at 0900.



Directions - North of Canyon Lake

At "T" intersection of Highways 306 and 3424 turn north on 3424; cross Highway 32; 3424 becomes Mail Route Road; at about 100 yards cross a creek; then turn right at a driveway with an old yellow Jeep full of cactus; take caution when going through the automatic gate staying right and drive to back of living area going past stop sign on tree, when you come to a green & yellow railroad storage container turn left, at the gate enter and close it behind you; there are horses onsite.
